Create an Ice Cream Flavor Based on an Arizona Landmark

Social Studies, Arizona History, Persuasive Writing 3-6th Grade

Standard: 3W-S3-C6-PO1-3, 4W-S3-C6-PO1-3, 5W-S3-C6-PO1-3, 6W-S3-C6-PO1-3

- **Objective:** TSW research an Arizona landmark, paraphrase information from a variety of sources including the Internet and reference materials, write persuasive text on why this landmark deserves to have it's own ice cream flavor, create the name and ingredients in the new ice cream flavor,
- Materials:Shamrock Farms graphic organizer with writing prompt
2-3 lessons allowing time for research online or in a library
Project Rubric
Photos of current Shamrock Farms Arizona Inspired ice cream flavors.

Procedures:

- 1. Ask students if they've ever tried any of the Shamrock Farms Arizona landmark ice cream flavors including Caramelback Mountain, Grand Butter PeCanyon, Snowbowl[™] Vanilla, Rocky Route 66, or Tombstone Roundup. (Show them pictures of the containers)
- 2. Explain to them that Shamrock Farms is looking to expand on these Arizona flavors and would like to hear from students to see what they think they can create.
- 3. Explain to students that this project involves Arizona History. Since Shamrock Farms Ice Creams are named after a landmark, a city or an attraction they can pick one of these things. (Either let students pick areas, or assign areas to them in Arizona to research.)
- 4. Depending on the age and ability level of students, you can either provide them with a list of cities and websites ahead of time or you can let them find it for themselves.
- 5. Give students the Shamrock Farms graphic organizer to help guide their research.
- 6. Discuss persuasive writing and how they will be using their research to help convince Shamrock Farms to choose their ice cream flavor and why the landmark, city or attraction they've picked deserves one.
- 7. Discuss the importance of an attention grabbing first paragraph and a strong conclusion. Review examples of what these mean with students from previous papers if necessary.
- 8. Once students have completed their graphic organizer, explain how they can take each section and turn it into a paragraph in their rough draft.
- 9. If necessary, briefly discuss the writing process (Pre-writing, Rough Draft, Revising, Editing, Publishing)
- 10. Encourage students to be creative with their final copy and tell them to include photos of what they think their new ice cream label might look like.
- 11. Provide copies of the Rubric to students and explain how they will be evaluated.
- 12. Teachers can either have students present their papers and vote for the top three and submit those to Shamrock Farms, or teachers may choose to submit the essays from the entire class.
